## Silver Spring Train Days & Gaithersburg Artifact

## Show A Tale of Two Events (November 2011)



Our first event in November was at the Silver Spring B&O station on the 5<sup>th</sup>. It comprised of three two ½ x six foot tables forming a T shaped layout. We used two inside curves along with six outside corners. This broke the normal chariot race style layout norm into sections that the visitor would have to walk around the layout to see. The layout modules were provided by Jeff and Christian Peck and the Hyland Clan. Dave Balderston of NVNtrak ran trains and our newest member Cliff Enz paid us a visit.

With the yard on the long side and with vegetation modules with multiple curves, the layout was much different than previous set ups. The layout comprised of 20 ft of straight track including the six foot yard plus the eight curve modules. The only difference with the inside curves is that the smaller radius curve is on the outside track.

During the layouts operation the museum ran the HO layout running through it's night to day and back to night sequence. Some new B&O wagon top cars had been added to the freight train that was running on that layout. The BRIO layout was in full operation with lots of kid power and future model railroaders. The station had it's customary tea, coffee, cocoa and nibbles laid out for us. Our operations at this station are always warm and fun.

At three o'clock we went into tear down mode, loaded the layout back into boxes and headed north to Gaithersburg. After finding the new building for the train show at the  $6^{\rm th}$  annual model train show. We set up and reconfigured the layout to two six ft tables and were running again by 5 pm. The train show ran on Sunday from 9 to 4. We had many visitors and questions from the public about N scale T Trak and N Trak. Matthew Whiting joined the Peck and Hyland Clans in operations. We had a visit from Jack Walsh who enjoyed the train show and visited the artifacts show. Other visitors to the set up were David Porter, David Freshwater, Bob Yetter Nick Skalias, and Rodney Bowman's son, all associated with NVNTrak. NVNTrak operated a small oval in an adjacent room. There was a large scale aristo elevated loop next to them. There were about a dozen vendors including National Capital Trains and Brian Bowles (formerly of RIP Track) who had a lot of n scale equipment from a large estate sale. The show was so busy that this was the first time I never got over to the rest of the Artifacts show.

The show is worth seeing for it is filled full of all sorts of railway artifacts. Everything from lanterns to steam engine headlights to books and timetables. Everything you didn't know you needed, but just had to have. It occurs every year on the first week of November. It is a different show from most others that we do as

it exposes n scale to not just fellow modelers, but railwayania people as well. All in all, we were very well received and have been invited back for next year.

Please verify your participation with the layout diagram. I don't believe I left anyone out but I have been known to make mistakes.



Debuting opening weekend November 25-27 on the Roundhouse's 60 foot wooden turntable is an incredible LEGO toy train layout. **NEW this year** is the Honorable **William Donald Schaefer's toy train layout** along with some of his treasured holiday memorabilia on exhibit for the first time ever and a new operating **floor level G-scale layout** (in front of Bay 7 - Jack).

Children receive candy canes personally from Santa and Frosty while traveling along the first commercial mile of railroad track laid in America. When Santa returns to the North Pole, train rides continue with Frosty the Snowman through December 31.

Item from the November/December 1986 Greater Baltimore N-Scale Associates Newsletter edited by Ken Mayer. This newsletter also included a listing of members and what modules/equipment they were bringing to the Greenberg show – everything needed for the layout was brought by members – no trailer back then. The members included: Andy Courtemanche, John Darlington, Ken Mayer, Bob Mohr, Wayne Morrow Jerry Mulford and Jack Walsh. The layout consisted of ten four foot modules and four club corners.

#### **INSTRUCTION SHEET - GBNSA TIME-TABLE**

The following are general guidelines intended to facilitate the operations of the GBNSA at the Greenberg Show. They are not intended to strictly control the membership, but rather to impose a certain measure of structure on the club's public operations.

- 1. There are 36 total hours of train running time over the two days of the show. Since it is expected that nine (9) members will be "working the show" and will wish to run their equipment, no member shall sign up for more than four (4) hours of track time until everyone has been given the opportunity to sign up. There are two 20 minute blocks of time, two 40 minute blocks of time, and 16 one hour blocks of time available on each day.
- 2. Should extra time become available, either from cancellations or from members not taking all of their time entitlement, the four (4) hour restriction will be waived. In fact, additional "train service" will be needed.
- 3. Members shall specify on the time-table the class of equipment they wish to run (Passenger or Freight) and their preferred operating di-rection (either clockwise (CUI) or counter-clockwise (CCW)) for the track they select. Members may be as explicit in their descriptions as they choose. The intent here is to provide information to the other members who will sign up later, so that they may vary the equipment running and the track directions.
- 4. Members may sign up for sequential blocks of time, but should not sign up to use more than one track at a time.
- 5. Members are free to exchange time among themselves. Such changes shall be noted on the time-table, so a record can be kept of who is supposed to be running.
- 6. Moving cars on and off the sidings along the branch line is a legi-timate benefit of signing up to use the inner (branch line) track.
- 7. Entire trains should be placed on or removed from a track only at the transfer times for that track.

The three members signed up to operate on the layout at any given time are to be given the radio headsets, and are responsible for the operation of the layout.

Members are reminded that they should bring sufficient proven motive power to the show to keep their trains running as much as possible during their time period. Also, balky cars should be removed from the layout by their owner as soon as they can be identified.
