Members that participated were Dave Balderston, Cliff Enz, Jeff and Christian Peck. The layout went well and all had a good time. We received many visits from the other clubs and got many positive comments on our set up. Most people were impressed by Mt. Hubungi being in front, showing off the new changes that Mat has done to the module which include a town on one side and a derailed train that fell off the cliff on the other.




Silver Spring Tower: November Review

B&O Festival of Trains: December Preview



We may not need or use all the modules listed above but we would like to thank everyone who has volunteered.



As a reminder, setup is Dec.12 – Dec. 14 during the Museum's normal business hours. Please drop off your modules first thing on Dec. 12 as all vehicles need to be out of the back lot by opening time. The first day of official running is Dec. 15. Tear down is currently scheduled for Dec. 30 at the end of the business day. Everyone is encouraged to show up to help. The more people we have helping, the faster we can tear down and head home. We have also received and committed to our first night run of the season which will be Dec. 15 from 7:00pm to 10:00pm. It's on Jack's schedule so sign up if you can make it.

All things considered, it looks like this year's show is shaping up nicely and should make for an excellent show for the B&O and BANTRAK. We encourage everyone to participate, have fun and strut your stuff in front of a large and appreciative public. New & Notable: Wilderness Club Corner Rebuild

Just a quick update on the BANTRAK corner rebuild. This module has been in the Club a long time, but the road-bed was in need of help and the scenery was in need of some tender love and care. We started a replacement corner 3 years ago and this served as the basis for a revitalized Wilderness Peak. With the help of some Club members, we have updated the track and the electric, as well as roughed in the recontoured landscape and added a rock casting or 2. We reduced the mass of the mountain on the mating surfaces and added more definition to the rocky faces with rock castings and foil rock races. We still need to add pavement to the road which replaces the old green line. The next application will be of blended turf and coarse turf, then hot glue shrubbery and









News & Notable: 2013 NMRA Convention (78th Annual)






New & Notable: BANTRAK Raffle Layout
