

Great Scale Model Train Show - BANTRAK Show Review



Despite the low member module turnout, the never ending cold days, close timing with the Roundhouse Holiday show, and Super Bowl Sunday happenings, we managed to make a showing at the Great Scale Model Train Show in Timonium.



The layout consisted of 8-9 member modules as well as 8 club modules.

The design provided for 2 smaller interlocking rectangles approximately
40' x 30' making the layout appear larger than it really was, and incorporated the clubs 6 outside and 2 inside corners. Designed this way the yard had flexibility to contract at 6' increments, by moving the 3' yard throats to the other ends of the corners vs previous layout plans where member modules are added and grouped between corners.



Friday set up was met with some challenges as the originally planned for space of $50' \times 70'$ was cut to $50' \times$ 50'. The group met to review the impact to the layout design, and decided we could run with the original design and still keep all planned modules, including the T-track. By 3pm, the layout was leveled, clamped and track joiners were under way. By 4:30 we had DCC cabling and booster boxes employed. Test running was completed and we were out by 6:15.

Train running on the layout went without a hitch both

Saturday and Sunday for most of the group, and show attendance and club running participation were high.

Coordination, assembly and tear down of the modules for all shows requires dedication of time and quite a bit of effort and planning from our members. I want to thank all members who gave of their time for set-up, spotting, running and tear down and even some of our newer members who pitched in to help others load the trailer.

Module Spotlight: Spring Hill

Module Name: Spring Hill Corners

Module Owner: Rick Dunstan

Module Size (Length x Width): 2 foot by 4 foot

Module Standard: NTrak

How long did it take to build? Took three weeks to build (the frame was donated to me already put together, I just had to clean it up a

bit)

Construction Method: I x 4 with plywood top with 2 x 2 removable legs with leveling bolts. The wiring is simple and uses a BANTRAK approved harness. Track feeders to rails are spaced every 2 feet

Leg Style: 2 x 2 wooden removable legs with leveling bolts

Highlight: I am proud of the design. It is a non-typical mini mod which can be lifted off and changed out with other mini mods I plan to build.

The whole module was built with some nature made materials (shale and river rocks), some home found materials (kitty litter) as well as the materials which were store bought. There are also lighted accessories on this.


I plan on making other modules as well as other mini mods for this module.
