The Engineer's Cab: Tim Nixon

BANTRAK was recently invited to provide a display layout for the Maryland Home & Garden Show at the Timonium Fairgrounds. In my column in last month's newsletter, I noted that the folks from the Great Scale Model Train Show had agreed to change the dates of the October show to accommodate the H&G show. During these discussions the H&G show asked the GSMTS to set-up a display layout at the H&G show; John "Scott" Geare of the GSMTS immediately thought of us and contacted me to see if we could help out. After polling the club, feedback was overwhelming in favor of doing the show, so I told Scott that we would be happy to provide a layout. This show will be a great opportunity for BANTRAK to reach a different audience. Most of our shows over the last 10 years or so have been to an audience already familiar with trains or model railroading; not since the days of the holiday mall shows have we displayed an N-Trak layout for the general (non-train) public. Since this is a new show for us and since we are working with a group that isn't familiar with us, there are a lot of questions that still need to be answered as we go forward, but we have plenty of time to work out the details. I will be coordinating this show and acting as the main point-of-contact with the H&G show.

This month's meeting is going to diverge from the norm in a couple of ways. First, we're meeting on the 4th Sunday this month, June 26th, instead of the 3rd Sunday so that members can spend Father's Day with their families instead of talking trains. Second, the June meeting will be at a "new" location for most of the N-Trak crowd, the Sykesville & Patapsco Railway tower in Sykesville, MD. We will be piggybacking on a T-Trak event already scheduled from 10 AM till 2 PM on that day; Ed Hyland is the POC for the Sykesville meeting.

Be sure and bring your camera to do some rail fanning, since the S&P tower is right next to the B&O's "Old Main Line" which is now run by CSX.

T-Trak Update / Editorial: Chris Hyland

Well, May was an interesting month. I spend a lot of time doing train events; unfortunately none of them were for BANTRAK. I was off to Kimberton PA for the Mid Atlantic Narrow gauge show. I was also out in Pittsburgh for the West Penn trolley show in Washington PA.

This month started out with the NY Transit Modelers in New Brunswick New Jersey, where we set up our subway T-Trak modules, ironically enough with Brooklyn N-Trak doing a Northeast Corridor only set up. The rest of the guys were equally busy running a Bowie event.

These events are always interesting as they provide a fresh view as to how one goes about what they are doing in the hobby. If all you see is the same old same stuff, you get stuck in a rut. You see the same modules and groups and you think that is out there. Washington PA for me got me out of that thinking. Not only did I get a chance to see trolleys going back to the 1890's from Pittsburgh, but also from WV, and Philly. The former Ohio Centrals mainline was right next to the museum doing switching operations in an area that looked like it was populated with Micro engineering and Trix modern day warehouses. The route that the trolley museum uses is one of the old mining railways around Pittsburgh and you can still see some of the coal bins off in the woods.

Coming back we visited Frostburg, followed the old Cumberland and Pennsylvania (later WM) right of way through Mt. Savage, Eckhart and other mining towns that have changed little since the 1900's. We even followed the Cumberland and Westernport trolley line that was out there before rejoining the B&O main at Cumberland.

That's a lot of modeling inspiration right there. So, if you are like me and there are only reruns on TV, and your favorite teams are either not in the Stanley Cup or you need a break from it all, check out the different groups that are offering mini cons out there. See new stuff and meet new people, you never know what you will see or do.

We have been on the road a lot and several of the key coordinators have had life-changing things happen to them. I would like to give a big thank you to those who have stepped up to grab the reins of coordinator. It may seem daunting at first, but you get the handle of it soon enough, then comes the politics with the people putting on the event.

There are several guidelines I would like to pass on to the new chicks learning to fly out of the nest. First, in no matter what you do, like in the military or being a member of a sports team, or a first responder, when you are Coordinator, you are the Squad leader. That is an awesome responsibility. Do what needs to get done, but think of the safety of your guys. Use common sense. If it is an outdoor event and you have high winds knocking over the boxcars, and it looks like it is going to rain, don't hesitate to call off the event. Better to be safe than sorry. Remember that not only do you represent the club and it's interests, but the welfare of your crew. Also be prepared to call the show off cause the events people don't have their own stuff together. We have canceled many a show cause the people that were putting it on just couldn't have the wherewithal to make it happen. Remember it's our personal stuff that we run every time we go out there, not the host's. I personally have been at events that went south very quickly. NVNTRAK had a nickname for one of these events. It was an outdoor free movie fest and the club called it instead of "Movies Under The Moon" it was called "Modules Under the Mud".

So that about sums it up for this month. Hope all of you out there are enjoying the summer and enjoying all the events that we have going on.
